Janine advised that she had emailed Ghyllside residents today to check on progress.

This project is still on hold due to the pandemic.

Janine advised that Continental Landscapes have put annual plants into the fern planters. She will email Terry Parr and advise that the annual plants need to be removed.
- The planter containing stones/boulders which was to be moved to a less prominent position on Dowker Lane will be repositioned in the next few days.
- 043/20/21**                    Planting at Briarigg (Minute 1004/19/20)  
Janine had received confirmation from the Treasurer that funding of £300 had been paid out of last year's budget.

- 048/20/21**                    **KENDAL IN BLOOM AND CUMBRIA IN BLOOM COMPETITIONS 2020**
- Janine had been approached by Mike Ormerod asking whether Committee wished to put up the Kendal in Bloom banners. Following a general discussion Councillor Blackman suggested that, although there would be no competition this year, the banners would brighten up the town and proposed they be installed. This was agreed unanimously.

- 049/20/21**                    **PROJECT UPDATE REPORT**
- Social Media
- Janine advised that the Management Committee had discussed the matter of a KTC Facebook page at their last meeting. A paper will be presented to the Management Committee at their next meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> June for further discussion. If approved, the page will incorporate a section for the Kendal in Bloom Committee.

Civic Planting

This work is more or less complete. Pierre commented that overall the planting has gone well, although the amount of plants was not quite as hoped due to supply issues caused by the pandemic. He mentioned planters by the Duke of Cumberland and Anchorite which contain the desired planting, however this will now be delayed until September.

Councillor Blackman suggested that photographs of the civic planting be obtained and published to the Facebook page if this is approved.

Banner on Aynam Road

Councillor Blackman requested Pierre remove the Northern Place banner situated on railings along Aynam Road which has been in place since 2019.

Edible Planter Outside the Leisure Centre

Councillor Rowley commented that the planter is a good example of what can be achieved with vegetable planters and encouraged Members to take a look at this planter when passing.

**050/20/21****FUNDING APPROVAL FOR ROTARY ANNUAL CROCUS PLANTING SCHEME**

Members considered a request from Kendal Rotary for funding of the annual crocus planting scheme. It was noted that planting on various sites had unfortunately suffered damage by contractors working in the vicinity. Mandy Nicholson advised that bulbs at Eskdale House had also been dug up by contractors and would have to be redone again. There is money remaining in budget so this can be redone in August/September but is very disappointing.

Kendal Rotary have advised that the price of gold crocuses has gone up and provided a choice of:

10,000 Ruby Giant for £585.00 or  
5,000 Ruby Giant and 5,000 Goldilocks for £742.50

It was noted that £400 is normally funded. Councillor Blackman proposed that the offer be increased to £500 this year. This was seconded by Councillor Edwards and carried with one abstention.

Janine pointed out that the sum of £500 would not cover the cost of the crocuses and it may be that the work would not proceed. Councillor Blackman put forward an amended proposal for funding of £585. This was seconded by Councillor Edwards and carried. This level of funding is possible due to Committee having available funds this year due to the pandemic, but may not be possible in future years.

**RESOLVED**

That funding of £585 be awarded to Kendal Rotary for the annual crocus planting scheme.

**052/20/21****REVIEW OF SPEND AGAINST BUDGET 2020/21**

Members considered the Financial Statement as at the end of May 2020.

Janine highlighted an amendment under 'Action Plan Projects' of £2k for the renovation of boundary signs and rings.

**053/20/21****ANY OTHER BUSINESS**Cumbria County Council Weed Spraying

Councillor Rowley advised that he had been contacted by two residents expressing concern that Cumbria County Council were spraying glyphosate on weeds which is a carcinogen. The concern related to operators not wearing protective equipment and spray drifting onto passers-by. He asked whether it would be within the remit of the Committee to write to Cumbria County Council expressing the concern.

Members agreed the matter does not fit well with the Committee's desire to encourage biodiversity. Councillor Blackman requested details be sent to Janine and a letter be drafted to Cumbria County Council. The letter will be copied to the chair of the Environment & Highways Committee.

Pierre referred to a course he attended on spraying weeds and advised that once diluted it may be safe for the operator and users. Councillor Rowley commented that there is a scientific dispute in this respect and will research further.

Kendal-in-Bloom Awards Ceremony

Councillor Blackman referred to the date booked in November for the Awards Ceremony and asked Members whether they felt it appropriate to hold an event in some form, although there would be no awards to present. Following a general discussion Members felt it was difficult to make arrangements for such an event, not knowing when social gatherings will be permitted. Councillor Sutton suggested using the new Facebook page for this purpose if it is approved. Councillor Rowley suggested there might be an opportunity to have some input into plans for Torchlight.

Brian Harrison asked whether the gift cards previously discussed would still be needed since there will be no competitions. It was confirmed they would not be required.

Brian Harrison mentioned that the organisers of the Torchlight procession were discussing the idea of a route which people could drive, as happens with Blackpool illuminations.
