COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY (CIL)
ANNUAL REPORT 2017/18

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge on new development that is collected by South Lakeland District Council (SLDC) to provide additional funding to help pay for the cost of infrastructure arising from new development such as highways and schools. CIL is charged on each square metre of additional floorspace.

The District Council pays Kendal Town Council 15% of CIL receipts for developments in its area. The Town Council can spend CIL receipts on:

- The provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or
- Anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area.

The Town Council is required by Regulations to publish a formal report on each year's CIL receipts. The following details relate to the year ended 31 March 2018:
